

DREXEL TO HOLD FORUM OF LOCAL CHILD EXPERTS POST APRIL 24 SCREENING OF *BULLY*

Bully, the controversial new film from Sundance and Emmy Award-winning director Lee Hirsch which explores the national epidemic of bullying through the eyes of young people affected by the often unspoken and violent practice, will open at the Drexel on Friday, April 13.

On Tuesday, April 24, following the 7pm screening, the Drexel Theatre will hold a moderated audience talk-back on bullying in today's society with a panel of local child experts. Panel members include Dr. John Campo, Chair of Psychiatry at The Ohio State University College of Medicine and Chief of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry at Nationwide Children's Hospital; The Honorable Yvette McGee Brown, Justice of the Ohio Supreme Court and founder of the Center for Child and Family Advocacy at Nationwide Children's Hospital; Mark Real, founding President of KidsOhio.org and former Chair of Mayor Michael Coleman's Education Advisory Committee; Susan Steinman, child therapist and founder of Bexley Operation Respect; and Harley Williams, Principal of Bexley High School and Middle School. The panel members will be joined by courageous Columbus-area students who will share their own stories of bullying.
